

Course Description for Better Grammar for Lawyers: Part Three

This course is a continuation of the successful *Better Grammar for Lawyers* parts one and two as a stand-alone program. You'll take a diagnostic 50-question grammar quiz in which you're asked to select the correct answer from the possibilities presented for each sentence. The quiz will test your knowledge of pronoun cases, subject–verb agreement, verb tenses, and general word usage—focusing on the most common lapses from Standard Written English. Professor Garner takes you through each item in the quiz, explaining the rule that leads to the correct answer in a way that reinforces your knowledge of the standard forms. If you're shaky in grammar, Professor Garner will immediately show you how to achieve a greater command of the language in short order; if you're a skilled grammarian, you'll undoubtedly discover some new refinements—and have fun doing it.

Many judges are on record complaining about the rudimentary grammatical lapses that seem pervasive within the profession today. This course, in three parts, is designed to remedy the defect.

Professor Bryan A. Garner is not only an acclaimed legal author, he is also regarded as one of the most accomplished grammarians of the English language, being the author of *Garner's Modern English Usage* and of Chapter 5 (—Grammar and Usagell) of *The Chicago Manual of Style*.

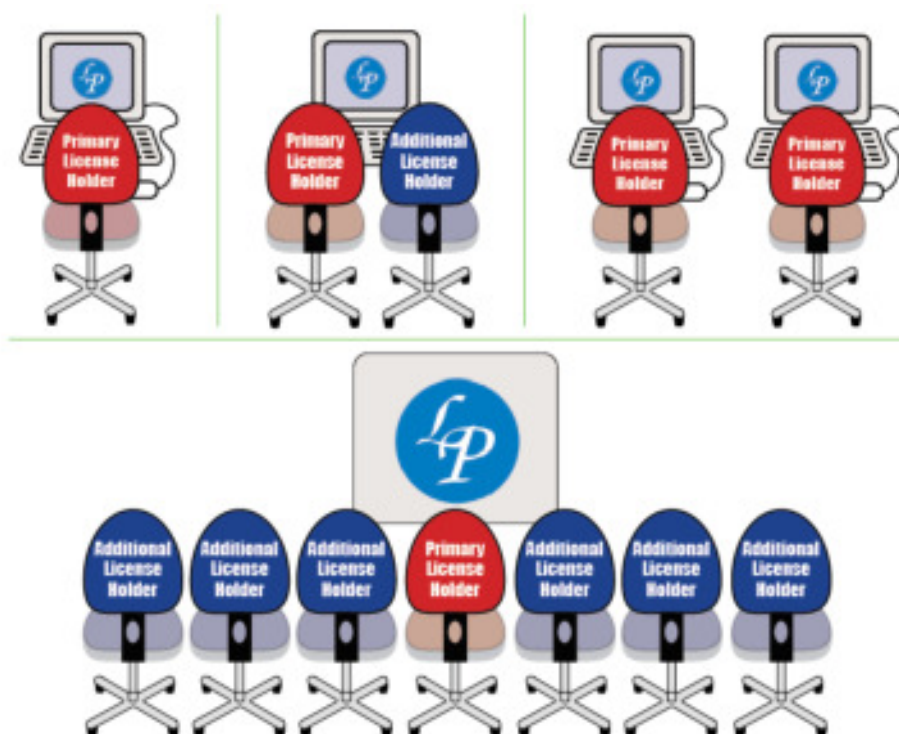
